- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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1 The General Assembly finds and declares that it is in the public interest to 2 ensure the public health, safety, and welfare by strictly regulating in this State the 3 importation, transportation, sale, transfer, breeding, raising, keeping, and possession 4 of certain animals which pose a possibility of the introduction of a disease or pest 5 harmful to humans, or endangers the physical safety of human beings.

7 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, "WILDLIFE" MEANS ANY FREE-ROAMING 8 WILD ANIMAL.

- 9 (2) "WILDLIFE" DOES NOT INCLUDE:
- 10 (I) DOMESTIC ANIMALS;
- 11 (II) COMMENSAL RODENTS;
- 12 (III) INVERTEBRATES; OR
- 13 (IV) FISH.
- 14 **(B) A PERSON MAY NOT:**

15 (1) IMPORT AND RELEASE WILDLIFE INTO THE STATE IF THE 16 WILDLIFE WAS CAPTURED OUTSIDE THE STATE; OR

17 (2) DISPOSE OF WILDLIFE IN THE STATE IF THE WILDLIFE WAS 18 KILLED OUTSIDE THE STATE.

(a) Any person who imports, transports, sells, transfers, breeds, raises,
keeps, or possesses any animal which is prohibited under § 18–219 of this subtitle is
guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$500, or
imprisonment not exceeding 1 year, or both.

(b) Any animal, whose possession or keeping is prohibited under § 18–219 of
this subtitle shall be considered a nuisance and a contraband, and is subject to seizure
by any authorized law–enforcement officer.

27(C)(1)A PERSON WHO VIOLATES § 18–219.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE IS28GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO:

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1(I)FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$500 OR2IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR BOTH; OR

(II) FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, A FINE NOT
 LESS THAN \$500 AND NOT EXCEEDING \$2,500 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT LESS
 THAN 1 YEAR AND NOT EXCEEDING 3 YEARS OR BOTH.

6 (2) IF A PERSON VIOLATES § 18–219.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE IN THE 7 COURSE OF THE PERSON'S EMPLOYMENT WITH A PEST CONTROL COMPANY 8 LICENSED BY THE STATE, THE LICENSE SHALL BE REVOKED.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 June 1, 2012.
