county or Baltimore City on a year-round basis, provided that the 180-day and the
minimum hour requirements under this section are met.

- 6 (2) Nothing in this section precludes a county board from conducting a year—round pilot study or program that is funded by the county board.
- 8 (f) Publicly funded prekindergarten programs are not subject to the 9 requirements of subsection (a) of this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2012.
