- 4 (A) EXCEPT AS PROHIBITED OR EXEMPTED BY FEDERAL LAW, AN INDIVIDUAL IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR FEDERAL PUBLIC BENEFITS OR STATE OR LOCAL PUBLIC BENEFITS IF THE INDIVIDUAL HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING OFFENSES ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2012:
 - (1) COMMON LAW RIOT UNDER THE LAWS OF THIS STATE; OR
- 9 (2) A CRIME UNDER THE LAWS OF ANOTHER STATE OR THE 10 UNITED STATES THAT WOULD BE COMMON LAW RIOT IF COMMITTED IN THIS 11 STATE.
- 12 (B) EXCEPT AS PROHIBITED OR EXEMPTED BY FEDERAL LAW, AN
 13 INDIVIDUAL RECEIVING FEDERAL PUBLIC BENEFITS OR STATE OR LOCAL
