# A BILL ENTITLED

## Orphans' Court – Minor – Guardianship of the Person

FOR the purpose of altering the authority of an orphans' court to exercise jurisdiction
over guardianship of the person of a minor by repealing a certain requirement
that the presiding judge of the orphans' court be a member of the Bar of
Maryland; providing that an orphans' court may exercise jurisdiction over
guardianship of the person of a minor in uncontested matters; providing for the
application of this Act; and generally relating to the jurisdiction of an orphans'
court over guardianship of the person of a minor.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Estates and Trusts

19 (a) (1) [The] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE 20 orphans' courts and the circuit courts have concurrent jurisdiction over guardians of 21 the person of a minor and over protective proceedings for minors.

22 (2) Upon petition of an interested person, a matter initiated in the 23 orphans' court may be transferred to the circuit court.

1 (b) Subject to Title 13.5 of this article, the circuit courts have exclusive 2 jurisdiction over protective proceedings for disabled persons.

3 (c) (1) An orphans' court may exercise jurisdiction over guardianship of 4 the person of a minor [if the presiding judge of the orphans' court is a member of the 5 bar] IN UNCONTESTED MATTERS, regardless of whether the minor who is the subject 6 of the petition for guardianship of the person has property, may inherit property, or is 7 destitute.

8 (2) An orphans' court that exercises jurisdiction or is requested to 9 exercise jurisdiction under this subsection may:

10 (i) Transfer the matter to the circuit court on a finding that the 11 best interests of the child require utilization of the equitable powers of the circuit 12 court; and

13

(ii) Waive the costs, if any, of a transfer under this paragraph.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be 15 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have 16 any effect on or application to any petition for guardianship of the person of a minor 17 filed before the effective date of this Act.

18 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect19 October 1, 2012.
