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Child Abuse and Neglect - Child Welfare - Alternative Response

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Secretary of Human Resources to establish an alternative response program for certain reports of child abuse or neglect; requiring the Department of Human Resources to establish an a certain advisory council to participate in the development of the alternative response implementation plan; specifying the composition and duties of the advisory council; providing for the chair of the advisory council; prohibiting certain reports of child abuse or neglect from being assigned for an alternative response; authorizing certain reports assigned for an alternative response to be reassigned for an immediate investigation based on certain factors; authorizing certain reports assigned for an investigation to be reassigned for an alternative response based on certain factors; requiring a local department to take certain actions following a report assigned for an alternative response; providing for the
