CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Real Property – Condominiums – Payment of Assessments and Fees

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a council of unit owners to petition the District Court 4 for relief if a unit owner has failed to pay assessments and fees for a unit for a $\mathbf{5}$ certain period of time and is renting the unit to a tenant; requiring a certified 6 copy of the petition to be mailed to the unit owner and served on the tenant 7 under certain circumstances; authorizing the District Court to enter an order 8 directing the tenant to pay rent due under the lease to certain persons under 9 certain circumstances; requiring the District Court to order certain persons to 10 apply rent payments received to the payment of certain assessments and fees 11 under certain circumstances; prohibiting a unit owner from taking any action 12 for failure to pay rent against a tenant under certain circumstances; and 13generally relating to the payment of assessments and fees in condominiums.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

4 (E) A UNIT OWNER MAY NOT TAKE ANY ACTION FOR FAILURE TO PAY 5 RENT AGAINST A TENANT WHO IS ORDERED BY THE DISTRICT COURT TO PAY 6 RENT TO THE COUNCIL OF UNIT OWNERS OR A DESIGNATED CUSTODIAN UNDER 7 THIS SECTION.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2012.
