16 17	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 21 22 23 24	(a) Within five calendar days after a person authorized to make the sale of a residential or commercial property has filed an order to docket or a complaint to foreclose a mortgage or deed of trust on residential or commercial property located in the County, the person authorized to make the sale shall give notice of the filing to the Director.



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1	(b) The notice shall identify the residential or commercial property subject to
2	foreclosure by street address and, if known, by tax account number, and shall include
3	the names and addresses, if known, of all owners of the residential or commercial
4	property subject to the foreclosure action and the name, address, and telephone
5	number of the person authorized to make the sale.

- (c) The person authorized to make the sale may provide to the Director the name, address, and telephone number of a person authorized to manage and maintain the residential or commercial property prior to the sale of the residential or commercial property.
- 10 (D) (1) THE DIRECTOR MAY COLLECT A FEE WITH EACH NOTICE 11 UNDER THIS SECTION THAT IS NO LESS THAN \$75 AND NO MORE THAN \$250.
- 12 **(2)** ANY FEE COLLECTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE USED 13 ONLY FOR:
- 14 **(I) ENSURING** THE **MAINTENANCE** AND UPKEEP OF 15 **PROPERTIES ORDINANCES** FORECLOSED  $\mathbf{BY}$ **ENFORCING** LOCAL OR 16 CONDUCTING MAINTENANCE; OR
- 17 (II) MAINTAINING THE FORECLOSED PROPERTY REGISTRY.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012.
