CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Local Authority – Use of Highways by Snowmobiles**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the authority of local jurisdictions to designate a portion
4 of a highway for snowmobile use to facilitate access between trails by repealing
5 the requirement that the snowmobile trails accessed be designated by the
6 Department of Natural Resources; making certain technical corrections; and
7 generally relating to the authority of local jurisdictions over the use of highways
8 by snowmobiles.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Transportation**

17 25–102.

18 (a) The provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law do not prevent a local
19 authority, in the reasonable exercise of its police power, from exercising the following
20 powers as to highways under its jurisdiction:

- 1 (1) Subject to the provisions of § 21–1003.1 of this article, regulating
2 or prohibiting the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles;
- 3 (2) Regulating traffic by means of police officers or traffic control
4 devices;
- 5 (3) Regulating or prohibiting processions or assemblies on highways;
- 6 (4) Designating particular highways or separate roadways as one–way
7 highways and requiring that all vehicles on them move in one specified direction;
- 8 (5) Regulating the speed and weight of vehicles in public parks;
- 9 (6) Designating any highway as a through highway or designating any
10 intersection as a stop intersection or a yield intersection;
- 11 (7) Restricting the use of highways as provided in Title 24 of this
12 article;
- 13 (8) Regulating the operation of bicycles, requiring them to be
14 registered, and imposing a registration fee;
- 15 (9) Regulating or prohibiting the turning of vehicles or specified types
16 of vehicles at intersections;
- 17 (10) Altering speed limits as provided in Title 21, Subtitle 8 of this
18 article;
- 19 (11) Regulating through truck traffic and prohibiting trucks from using
20 any highway or alley that is not designated or maintained as a part or extension of the
21 State or federal highway system, provided the local authority has designated an
22 adequate alternate route for diverted truck traffic;
- 23 (12) Adopting any other traffic regulations as specifically authorized in
24 the Maryland Vehicle Law;
- 25 (13) Regulating taxi stands, including taxi stands in the middle of a
26 block;
- 27 (14) (i) Except in Garrett County, designating a certain portion of
28 highways [or roadways] upon which snowmobiles may travel for the sole purpose of
29 gaining access to snowmobile trails [which have been designated by the Department of
30 Natural Resources]. However, only those highways [and roadways] which divide
31 snowmobile trails and which would otherwise obstruct direct access between
32 snowmobile trails may be so designated **BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITY**; and

1 (ii) In Garrett County, permitting a person to cross a highway
2 [or roadway] on a snowmobile at a right angle, and designating a certain portion of
3 highways [or roadways] upon which snowmobiles may travel for the sole purpose of
4 gaining access to snowmobile trails [which have been designated by the Department of
5 Natural Resources];

6 (15) Requiring a motorized minibike to be permitted by the local
7 authority, and imposing a permit fee;

8 (16) In Allegany County, designating crossings on county highways
9 where a person operating a golf cart may cross the highway for continued access to any
10 portion of a golf course; and

11 (17) Restricting use of a low speed vehicle on a highway.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2012.
