A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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County Boards of Education - Children in Home Instruction Programs

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "full-time equivalent enrollment" to 4 include certain children participating in a home instruction program in 5 accordance with a certain provision of law; requiring, notwithstanding any other 6 provision of law, a county board of education to count certain children 7 participating in a certain home instruction program in the county's full-time 8 equivalent enrollment if the parent or guardian of the child agrees to require 9 the child to participate in a certain testing program; requiring a county board to remit a certain amount of money to the parent or guardian of a child receiving 10 home instruction under certain circumstances; requiring a certain parent or 11 12 guardian to use certain money to purchase educational materials for a certain 13 purpose; defining a certain term; and generally relating to counting children in home instruction programs in full-time equivalent enrollment counts. 14

5 6 7	(ii) Except as provided in item (iii) of this paragraph, the product of the number of students enrolled in kindergarten programs on September 30 of the prior school year and:
8	1. 0.60 in fiscal year 2004;
9	2. 0.70 in fiscal year 2005;
10	3. 0.80 in fiscal year 2006;
11	4. 0.90 in fiscal year 2007; and
12 13	5. 1.00 in fiscal year 2008 and each fiscal year thereafter;
14 15	(iii) In Garrett County, the number of students enrolled in kindergarten programs on September 30 of the prior school year; [and]
16 17 18	(iv) The number of full—time equivalent students, as determined by a regulation of the Department, enrolled in evening high school programs during the previous school year; AND
19 20 21	(V) The number of children participating in a home instruction program in accordance with the provisions of § 4–110 of this article.
22 23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2012 .
