- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 17 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a person driving or otherwise in charge of a motor vehicle may not leave it unattended until the engine is stopped, the ignition locked, the key removed, and the brake effectively set.
- 20 (b) A person driving or otherwise in charge of a motor vehicle may not leave 21 the motor vehicle unattended until, if the vehicle is on a grade, the front wheels are 22 turned to the curb or side of the highway.



- 1 (c) (1) When a cat or dog is left in the unattended vehicle of an on-duty 2 law enforcement officer or an animal control officer, [the provisions of] subsection (a) 3 of this section [do] **DOES** not apply to the law enforcement officer or the animal control 4 officer.

 6 PERSON WHO IS IN CHARGE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE THAT HAS RECENTLY HAD
