## Task Force to Study the Renovation and Repair Needs of Senior Homeowners

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Housing and Community 4 Development, with the assistance of the Department of Aging, the Department  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 of Health and Mental Hygiene, and the Department of Human Resources, to 7 create a task force to study methods for identifying and understanding the renovation and repair needs of low-income and limited-income senior 8 9 homeowners and identifying resources to assist senior homeowners; requiring the task force to consult with and enlist the participation of certain 10 11 stakeholders; requiring the Department of Housing and Community 12 Development to report on the findings of the task force to the Governor and the 13General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the creation of a task force to study the 14 renovation and repair needs of low-income and limited-income senior 1516 homeowners.

## 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That:

19 (a) The Department of Housing and Community Development, with the 20 assistance of the Department of Aging, the Department of Health and Mental 21 Hygiene, and the Department of Human Resources, shall create a task force to study 22 methods for:

30 June 1, 2012. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31,

1 2013, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be 2 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
