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3 FOR the purpose of increasing the number of commemorative registration plates that 4 the Motor Vehicle Administration may issue at any one time; requiring the 5 Administration to issue specially designed commemorative registration plates to 6 enhance public awareness of the importance of native plants and wildflowers to 7 the Chesapeake Bay; requiring the Administration to transfer a certain portion 8 of the additional registration fee charged for commemorative plates issued 9 under this Act to the Chesapeake Bay Trust for the preservation and protection of native plants and wildflowers; creating a native plants and wildflowers 10 project area within the Chesapeake Conservation Corps; and generally relating 11 12to commemorative license plates and the preservation and protection of native plants and wildflowers. 13

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 2 (a) The Administration may issue special commemorative original or substitute registration plates for any geographical, historical, natural resource, or environmental commemoration of statewide significance.
- 5 (B) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ISSUE A SPECIAL ORIGINAL OR 6 SUBSTITUTE REGISTRATION PLATE TO COMMEMORATE NATIVE PLANTS AND 7 WILDFLOWERS.
- [(b)] (C) The owner of a vehicle, or a lessee of the vehicle under a lease not intended as security, or a director, officer, employee, or partner of a business entity that owns the vehicle considered eligible by the Administration may apply to the Administration for the assignment of a commemorative registration plate under this section if the vehicle is included in one of the following classes:
- 13 (1) A Class A (passenger) vehicle;
- 14 (2) A Class E (truck) vehicle with a manufacturer's rated capacity of one ton or less;
- 16 (3) A Class G (trailer) vehicle; or
- 17 (4) A Class M (multipurpose) vehicle.
- [(c)] (D) (1) [An original] ORIGINAL or substitute commemorative plate] PLATES may only be issued under this section for a fixed period of 2 consecutive years after [its] THEIR initial issuance.
- 21 (2) The Administration may [only] **NOT** issue [one] **MORE THAN TWO** 22 commemorative [plate] **PLATES** under this section at any one time.
- [(d)] (E) (1) In addition to the annual registration fee otherwise required under this title, an owner of a vehicle assigned a commemorative registration plate under this section shall pay:
- 26 (i) An additional initial registration fee set by the 27 Administration when the new registration plates are issued to the vehicle under this 28 section; or
- 29 (ii) An additional renewal fee set by the Administration each 30 time the plate is renewed.
- 31 (2) (i) The Administration shall set the additional initial registration fee at a level that will enable the Administration to recover its costs under this section.

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- (iii) The Administration shall retain a portion of the additional initial registration fee that is sufficient to allow the Administration to recover any costs of issuing and distributing commemorative plates under this section.
- 7 (iv) Any surplus moneys remaining after the Administration has 8 recovered the costs of issuing a commemorative plate under this section and moneys 9 collected for additional renewal fees may not be retained by or transferred to any 10 agency of the State for any purpose.
- 11 (v) Notwithstanding subparagraph (iv) of this paragraph, the 12 surplus moneys and moneys collected for additional renewal fees may be retained for 13 the [purpose] PURPOSES described in [paragraph] PARAGRAPHS (3) AND (4) of this 14 subsection.
- 15 (3) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS
 16 SUBSECTION, THE surplus moneys and moneys collected for additional renewal fees
 17 shall be disbursed by the Administration to a nonprofit organization that is:
- 18 (i) Closely related to the geographical, historical, natural resource, or environmental theme which the plate commemorates; and

- [(4)] (5) No portion of the additional initial registration or renewal fees may be credited to the Gasoline and Motor Vehicle Revenue Account for distribution under § 8–403 or § 8–404 of this article.
- [(e)] (F) (1) The Administration shall adopt regulations not inconsistent with the Maryland Vehicle Law to govern the issuance of special registration plates under this section.
- 34 (2) Before designating any nonprofit organization to receive any surplus moneys or moneys collected for additional renewal fees and before distributing

9 10 11 12	(3) The Administration shall consult with the nonprofit organization designated to receive moneys under this section to establish a schedule under which the Administration will transfer to the nonprofit organization revenue collected on behalf of the nonprofit organization under this section.
13 14 15	[(f)] (G) The additional fees to the annual registration fee required by this section are not required for special registration of a vehicle that is exempt under § 13–903 of this title, or a vehicle with a special registration plate recognizing:
16	(1) The Maryland National Guard; or
17 18	(2) A volunteer fire department, volunteer rescue squad, or volunteer ambulance company in this State.
19 20	[(g)] (H) (1) A special registration number as specified by the Administration and assigned under this section may consist of:
21	(i) Any combination of:
22	1. Letters; and
23	2. Numerals; and
24 25 26	(ii) Any design approved by the Administration that adequately reflects the geographical, historical, natural resource, or environmental theme which the plate commemorates.
27 28	(2) A special registration number or design assigned under this section shall be displayed on the registration plates for the vehicle.
29 30 31	(3) The Administration shall consult with the nonprofit organization designated to receive moneys under this section with respect to any design of the Chesapeake Bay Commemorative License Plate.

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- 2 (a) The Corps Program's projects and activities shall meet an identifiable public need, with specific emphasis on projects that result in long-term preservation, protection, and conservation of the environment, in areas including environmental restoration, agricultural and forestry, infrastructure, [and] educational improvements, AND NATIVE PLANTS AND WILDFLOWERS.
- - (b) Environmental restoration projects may include:
- 8 (1) Specific nutrient reduction activities, such as planting of bay 9 grasses and oysters and installing natural shorelines on public spaces; and
- 10 (2) Working with communities to improve their environmental impacts and activities and to encourage appropriate environmental stewardship.
- 12 (c) Agricultural and forestry projects may include working with Corps
 13 Program volunteers from rural areas of the State in partnership with the agricultural
 14 community in projects to prevent or reduce nutrient runoff.
 - (d) Infrastructure projects may include:
- 16 (1) Improving the energy efficiency of housing for elderly and 17 low–income households;
- 18 (2) Implementing clean energy projects in communities to enhance the 19 use of renewable energy, including free and low–cost energy audits; and
- 20 (3) Building or assisting in building infrastructure to promote 21 environmental education including outdoor classrooms, nature trails, and schoolyard 22 habitats and watershed restoration, stream restoration, rain gardens, and other 23 low–impact development projects.
 - (e) Educational projects may include:
- 25 (1) Developing interactive environmental education and energy conservation education for elementary and secondary school students and the public;
- 27 (2) Developing curriculum targeted at training high school students 28 and apprentices to obtain skills necessary to create and implement clean energy 29 projects in their communities and to compete for jobs in the emerging clean energy 30 sector; and
- 31 (3) Assisting schools to become "green schools" and reduce energy 32 costs through hands—on projects with their students.

- 1 (f) Energy conservation projects may include the projects defined in \S 8–1913(d) of this part.
- 3 (G) NATIVE PLANT AND WILDFLOWER PROJECTS MAY INCLUDE
 4 WORKING WITH CORPS PROGRAM VOLUNTEERS ON PROJECTS TO PRESERVE,
 5 PROTECT, AND CONSERVE NATIVE PLANTS AND WILDFLOWERS.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2012.
