## 1 AN ACT concerning

# Family Law – <u>Interim and</u> Temporary Peace and Protective Orders – Duration

FOR the purpose of extending the duration of a <u>an interim or</u> temporary peace <u>or</u>
<u>protective</u> order <del>or a temporary protective order</del> under certain circumstances;
<u>requiring a court to hold a temporary or final peace or protective order hearing</u>
<u>by a certain time under certain circumstances</u>; and generally relating to peace
orders and protective orders.
