1 AN ACT concerning

$\mathbf{2}$ **Environment – Penalty for Sewage Overflow – Establishment and** 3 Distribution

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of the Environment to impose a civil $\mathbf{5}$ penalty on certain persons for any sewage overflow or bypass that results in the 6 discharge of raw or diluted sewage into the waters of the State; establishing a 7 formula to determine the amount of the civil penalty; authorizing the 8 Department to retain certain proceeds from the civil penalties to cover certain 9 administrative expenses; requiring the Department to distribute certain proceeds from the civil penalties to the Fisheries Research and Development 10 Fund for certain use; requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations; 11 12authorizing the receipt by the Fund of proceeds from the civil penalties; and generally relating to the establishment and distribution of civil penalties for a 13 sewage overflow or bypass. 14
