- 12 (e) The Department shall submit to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of 13 the State Government Article, the General Assembly, on or before September 1, 2004, 14 a report on the progress of the Maryland Virtual Learning Opportunities Program, 15 including a description of the available [on-line] ONLINE courses and services.

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SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
