Education – Dyslexia Testing and Services for Dyslexic Students – Pilot
 Program

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to establish a pilot 5 program for dyslexia and related disorder testing; requiring the Department to 6 recommend appropriate testing methods and appropriate services to a student 7 identified as having dyslexia or a related disorder; authorizing a county board to 8 participate in the program in accordance with certain requirements; subject to a 9 certain limitation, requiring county boards to test students for dyslexia or related disorders under certain circumstances; requiring a county board to 10 provide a certain student with certain remedial education; requiring the 11 12 Department to submit a certain report by a certain date to the General Assembly; defining certain terms; and generally relating to testing for dyslexia 13 and providing services to dyslexic students. 14

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 24 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 25 MEANINGS INDICATED.



- 1 (2) "DYSLEXIA" MEANS A LANGUAGE PROCESSING DISORDER
- 2 THAT MAY BE MANIFESTED BY DIFFICULTY PROCESSING EXPRESSIVE OR
- 3 RECEPTIVE, ORAL OR WRITTEN LANGUAGE DESPITE ADEQUATE INTELLIGENCE,
- 4 EDUCATIONAL EXPOSURE, AND CULTURAL OPPORTUNITY, INCLUDING
- 5 DIFFICULTY WITH THE ALPHABET, READING COMPREHENSION, WRITING, OR
- 6 SPELLING.
- 7 (3) "RELATED DISORDER" MEANS A DISORDER RELATED OR
- 8 SIMILAR TO DYSLEXIA, INCLUDING DEVELOPMENTAL AUDITORY
- 9 IMPERCEPTION, DYSPHASIA, SPECIFIC DEVELOPMENTAL DYSLEXIA, DYSPRAXIA,
- 10 DEVELOPMENTAL DYSGRAPHIA, AND DEVELOPMENTAL SPELLING DISABILITY.
- 11 (B) (1) (I) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH A PILOT
- 12 PROGRAM FOR DYSLEXIA AND RELATED DISORDER TESTING.
- 13 (II) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS
- 14 TO PARTICIPATING COUNTY BOARDS AS TO THE APPROPRIATE TESTING
- 15 METHOD AND THE APPROPRIATE SERVICES TO PROVIDE A STUDENT WHO IS
- 16 IDENTIFIED AS BEING DYSLEXIC OR AS HAVING A RELATED DISORDER.
- 17 (2) (I) EACH COUNTY BOARD MAY PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT
- 18 **PROGRAM.**
- 19 (II) A PARTICIPATING COUNTY BOARD SHALL COMPLY WITH
- 20 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.
- 21 (C) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, AT THE
- 22 REQUEST OF A PARENT, A STUDENT, A SCHOOL NURSE, A TEACHER, OR ANY
- 23 OTHER SCHOOL PERSONNEL WHO HAS REASON TO BELIEVE THAT A STUDENT
- 24 SHOULD BE TESTED FOR DYSLEXIA AND RELATED DISORDERS, THE COUNTY
- 25 BOARD SHALL TEST THE STUDENT.
- 26 (2) IF SOMEONE OTHER THAN A PARENT IS REQUESTING A
- 27 STUDENT BE TESTED FOR DYSLEXIA OR A RELATED DISORDER, THE TEST MAY
- 28 NOT BE CONDUCTED UNLESS A PARENT OR ANOTHER LEGAL GUARDIAN
- 29 APPROVES.
- 30 (D) IF THE TEST SUBSTANTIATES THE CONCERN THAT A STUDENT HAS
- 31 DYSLEXIA OR A RELATED DISORDER, THE COUNTY BOARD SHALL PROVIDE
- 32 EDUCATIONAL REMEDIATION IN AN APPROPRIATE MULTISENSORY, SYSTEMATIC
- 33 LANGUAGE-BASED EDUCATION PROGRAM THAT IS PERTINENT TO THE
- 34 STUDENT'S DISORDER.

- 1 (E) BY DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT
  2 TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE
  3 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE NUMBER OF COUNTY BOARDS PARTICIPATING
  4 IN THE PILOT PROGRAM AND THE IMPACT OF THE PILOT PROGRAM ON STUDENT
  5 LEARNING.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2012.
