1 AN ACT concerning

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Department of Agriculture - Animal Waste Technology Fund

- 3 FOR the purpose of repealing the provisions relating to financial assistance for certain 4 animal waste technology projects from the Maryland Economic Development 5 Assistance Fund in the Department of Business and Economic Development; 6 establishing the Animal Waste Technology Fund, a special, nonlapsing fund in 7 the Department of Agriculture, establishing the purposes, uses, and funding 8 sources of the Fund; requiring the Secretary of Agriculture to administer the 9 Fund and establish certain procedures; authorizing the Secretary to contract for 10 certain services and impose certain fees; establishing an Animal Waste Technology Fund Advisory Committee; establishing the membership, staffing, 11 12 role, and responsibilities of the Advisory Committee; authorizing the Secretary 13 to take certain actions to protect the interests of the Department of Agriculture 14 in certain financing transactions; defining certain terms; and generally relating 15 to funding for animal waste technology projects.
