#### HOUSE BILL 1334

1 (f) (1) This subsection does not apply to a person who is entitled to use 2 the controlled dangerous substance under the laws of the State.

3 (2) A person may not cause a life-threatening injury to another as a 4 result of the person's negligently driving, operating, or controlling a motor vehicle or 5 vessel while the person is impaired by a controlled dangerous substance as defined in 6 § 5-101 of this article.

7 (3) A violation of this subsection is life-threatening injury by motor 8 vehicle or vessel while impaired by a controlled dangerous substance.

9 (4) A person who violates this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor 10 and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding [2] **3** years or a fine not 11 exceeding [\$3,000] **\$5,000** or both.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2012.
