A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Medicaid Sustainability Commission

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Medicaid Sustainability Commission; providing 4 for the membership, chair, and staffing of the Commission; prohibiting a 5 member of the Commission from receiving certain compensation, but 6 authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Commission 7 to study and make recommendations regarding certain matters relating to the 8 sustainability of the Maryland Medical Assistance Program; requiring the 9 Commission to consider certain input when performing its duties; requiring certain recommendations of the Commission to provide for a plan to develop an 10 alternative to a certain assessment; requiring the Commission to make certain 11 12reports to the Governor and certain committees of the General Assembly on or 13 before certain dates; declaring the intent of the General Assembly; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Medicaid 14 Sustainability Commission. 15

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That:
- 18 (a) There is a Medicaid Sustainability Commission.

 - (2) In performing its duties under this subsection, the Commission shall consider the input of stakeholders not represented on the Commission and the work of other Medicaid—related reform workgroups.

- (3) The recommendations made by the Commission under this subsection shall provide for a plan to develop an alternative to the assessment under § 19–214(d)(1)(ii) of the Health General Article.
- (g) On or before December 15, 2012, the Commission shall submit an interim report of its findings and recommendations that are specific and actionable to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the Senate Finance Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, and the House Health and Government Operations Committee.
- (h) On or before June 30, 2013, the Commission shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations that are specific and actionable to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the Senate Finance Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, and the House Health and Government Operations Committee.
- (i) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the recommendations of the Commission be implemented no later than fiscal year 2015 with the effect of replacing the assessment under § 19–214(d)(1)(ii) of the Health General Article.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2012. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
