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## Youth Camps - Fees and Inspections - Exemptions

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene from 4 imposing a fee for the purpose of inspecting, monitoring, and regulating certain 5 youth camps; requiring a certain camp to make a certain certification to the 6 Department of Health and Mental Hygiene on or before a certain date each year 7 regarding compliance of certain programs and activities conducted by the youth 8 camp with certain laws and regulations; exempting a youth camp from 9 inspection by the Department if the youth camp completes a certain self-inspection report; authorizing the Department to impose a certain civil fine 10 on a youth camp under certain circumstances; and generally relating to youth 11 12 camp fees and inspections.

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
