A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Department of Education – Oral Health Education – Certification and**
3 **Monitoring**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain county superintendents to make certain
5 certifications regarding oral health education on or before a certain date each
6 year; requiring the State Department of Education to support and facilitate
7 certain education and develop a process to monitor certain implementation of
8 certain education; requiring the Department to report certain information to the
9 Governor and General Assembly on or before a certain date each year; and
10 generally relating to oral health education in the State.

21 Preamble

22 WHEREAS, Tooth decay is the single most common chronic childhood disease
23 and over 50% of children aged 5 to 9 years old have at least one cavity or filling; and

24 WHEREAS, Pain and suffering due to untreated dental diseases can lead to
25 problems eating, speaking, and attending to learning; and

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

1 WHEREAS, Safe and effective measures exist to prevent the most common
2 dental diseases such as tooth decay and periodontal diseases; now, therefore,

3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
4 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 **Article – Education**

6 **4–111.1.**

7 (A) IN ADDITION TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 7–401 OF THIS ARTICLE,
8 ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, EACH COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT
9 SHALL CERTIFY TO THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT THAT ORAL HEALTH
10 EDUCATION, INCLUDING ORAL DISEASE PREVENTION AND DENTAL HEALTH
11 PROMOTION, IS BEING TAUGHT IN THE COUNTY.

12 (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

13 (1) SUPPORT AND FACILITATE ORAL HEALTH EDUCATION IN
14 EVERY COUNTY; AND

15 (2) DEVELOP A PROCESS TO MONITOR IMPLEMENTATION OF
16 ORAL HEALTH EDUCATION AS CERTIFIED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS
17 SECTION.

18 (C) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT
19 SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2–1246 OF THE STATE
20 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, REGARDING THE
21 MONITORING AND IMPLEMENTATION OF ORAL HEALTH EDUCATION IN THE
22 STATE.

23 **7–401.**

24 (a) With the assistance of the county health department, each county board
25 shall provide:

26 (1) Adequate school health services;

27 (2) Instruction in health education, including the importance of
28 physical activity, ORAL DISEASE PREVENTION, AND DENTAL HEALTH PROMOTION
29 in maintaining good health; and

30 (3) A healthful school environment.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
2 July 1, 2012.
