1 AN ACT concerning

Calvert, Charles, and St. Mary's Counties – Turkey Hunting on Private Property – Sundays

FOR the purpose of authorizing a person to hunt turkey on private property on certain
Sundays in Calvert County, Charles County, and St. Mary's County; making
this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to turkey hunting on
Sundays.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 Article – Natural Resources

16 10-410.

17 (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraphs (2), (3), (4), and (6) of this 18 subsection, a person may not hunt any game bird or mammal on Sundays.

Subject to the provisions of § 10-415 of this subtitle, in Calvert 1 (3) $\mathbf{2}$ County, Charles County, and St. Mary's County, a person may hunt deer on private 3 property on: 4 The first Sunday of the bow hunting season in November; (i) $\mathbf{5}$ and 6 (ii) Each Sunday in the deer firearms season. 7 (4)Provided that the provisions of § 10-415 of this subtitle are met 8 and subject to paragraph (5) of this subsection, the Department may allow a person to hunt deer on private property on the first Sunday of: 9 10 (i) The bow hunting season in November; and 11 (ii) The deer firearms season. 12The Sunday deer hunting provisions under paragraph (4) of this (5)subsection do not apply: 13In Baltimore, Howard, and Prince George's counties; and 14(i) 15(ii) In Baltimore City. 16 A person who is 16 years of age or younger may hunt deer with a (6)17firearm on a Sunday through participation in the junior deer hunt established under § 10–405(a) of this subtitle. 18 19SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 20measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, 21has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members 22elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from 23the date it is enacted.
