14 15	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18	(A)	Unless the parties agree otherwise, alimony terminates:
19		(1) on the death of either party;
20		(2) on the marriage of the recipient; [or]



1	(3) ON THE COHABITATION OF THE RECIPIENT FOR A PERIOD OF
2	AT LEAST 90 DAYS WITH AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS NOT A MEMBER OF THE
3	RECIPIENT'S FAMILY; OR

- 6 (B) IN THIS SECTION, COHABITATION SHALL BE PRESUMED IF:
- 7 (1) THE RECIPIENT RESIDED WITH THE OTHER INDIVIDUAL FOR 8 THE PERIOD SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (A)(3) OF THIS SECTION;
- 9 (2) THE RECIPIENT AND THE OTHER INDIVIDUAL ENGAGED IN A 10 RELATIONSHIP; AND
- 11 (3) THE RECIPIENT PROVIDED ANY ECONOMIC BENEFIT TO OR 12 RECEIVED ANY ECONOMIC BENEFIT FROM THE OTHER INDIVIDUAL AS A RESULT 13 OF THE RELATIONSHIP.
- 14 (C) ON THE MARRIAGE OR COHABITATION OF THE RECIPIENT, THE 15 RECIPIENT IMMEDIATELY SHALL NOTIFY THE PARTY WHO IS REQUIRED TO PAY 16 ALIMONY.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012.
