2 (M) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 21–209 OF THIS SUBTITLE AND UNLESS 3 OTHERWISE DIRECTED BY A POLICE OFFICER, IF NO LIGHTED INDICATION IS 4 VISIBLE TO A DRIVER APPROACHING A TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNAL, THE DRIVER 5 SHALL REDUCE SPEED AND PREPARE TO YIELD TO OTHER VEHICLES IN OR 6 APPROACHING THE INTERSECTION.

7 [(m)] (N) Except for those provisions of this section that by their very nature 8 cannot apply, this section applies to a traffic control signal placed at a location other 9 than an intersection. Each stop required by the signal shall be made at a sign or 10 marking on the pavement indicating where the stop shall be made or, if there is no 11 sign or marking, at the signal.

Vehicular traffic approaching a highway from an exit ramp from an expressway,
as defined in § 21–101(k) of this title, and facing a nonfunctioning traffic control signal
at the intersection of the exit ramp and the highway shall:
