15	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19	(a) An individual who has the human immunodeficiency virus may not
20	knowingly transfer or attempt to transfer the human immunodeficiency virus to
21	another individual.
22	(b) A person who violates the provisions of this section is guilty of a

[misdemeanor] FELONY and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding [\$2,500]

\$10,000 or imprisonment not exceeding [3] 25 years or both.



SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012.
