11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 13 Article Public Safety
- 14 14–111.

15 (a) Only the principal executive officer of a political subdivision may declare 16 a local state of emergency.

17 (b) (1) Except with the consent of the governing body of the political
18 subdivision, a local state of emergency may not continue or be renewed for longer than
19 [7] 30 days.
