- 7 (ii) Nothing contained in this paragraph may be construed to 8 allow the issuance of a temporary license to drive for a period longer than the period 9 described in this subsection.
- 10 (iii) The Administration shall indicate on the face and in the 11 machine-readable zone of a temporary license to drive that the license is a temporary 12 license to drive.
- 13 (6) A holder of a temporary license to drive who had temporary lawful 14 status at the time of the issuance of the temporary license to drive shall present 15 satisfactory documentary evidence of lawful status if the holder applies for issuance or 16 renewal of any license to drive under this subtitle.
