1 AN ACT concerning

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Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program – Sunset Extension

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1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 Article - Insurance 4 14–106. The subsidy that a nonprofit health service plan is required to provide to 5 6 the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program under subsection (d)(1)(iii) of this 7 section may not exceed: 8 (1) for the period of January 1, 2006 through June 30, 2006, 9 \$8,000,000; for fiscal years 2008 through [2013] **2015**, \$14,000,000; and 10 (2) for any year, the value of the nonprofit health service plan's 11 (3) 12premium tax exemption under § 6–101(b) of this article. 13 Chapter 153 of the Acts of 2002, as amended by Chapter 282 of the Acts of 2005, Chapter 345 of the Acts of 2006, Chapter 509 of the Acts of 2007, Chapter 14 558 of the Acts of 2008, and Chapter 119 of the Acts of 2010 15 16 SECTION 13. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That: 17 No later than June 1, 2003, the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene and the carrier that is required to offer the Short-Term Prescription Drug 18 19 Subsidy Plan under Title 15, Subtitle 6 of the Health – General Article shall transfer 20 all Plan records, data, and other information necessary to operate and administer the 21Senior Prescription Drug Program established under this Act to the Board of the 22Maryland Health Insurance Plan. 23 Each individual enrolled in the Short-Term Prescription Drug **(2)** Subsidy Plan, established under Title 15, Subtitle 6 of the Health – General Article, on 24June 30, 2003 shall, at the option of the enrollee and subject to the payment of all 2526necessary premiums and copayments, be automatically enrolled in the Senior 27 Prescription Drug Program established under this Act. 28It is the intent of the General Assembly that the transition of 29enrollees from the Short-Term Prescription Drug Subsidy Plan to the Senior 30 Prescription Drug Program be accomplished without interruption of benefits for enrollees. 31

(4) Subsidies shall be offered to enrollees through the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program established under Title 14, Subtitle 5, Part II of the Insurance Article beginning January 1, 2006. At the end of December 31, [2012]

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2014 , the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program established under Title 14, Subtitle 5, Part II, as amended, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
(5) Beginning April 1, 2003, the carrier required to offer the Short–Term Prescription Drug Subsidy Plan under Title 15, Subtitle 6 of the Health – General Article and the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program under Title 14, Subtitle 5 of the Insurance Article shall subsidize the Plan and beginning January 1, 2006, the Program, using the value of the carrier's premium tax exemption.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012.
