17 18	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 22 23	[(a) It shall be the policy of the State that the emphasis of funding for public school construction projects shall be to target the rehabilitation of existing schools to ensure that facilities in established neighborhoods are of equal quality to new schools.
24 25	(b)] This [section] SUBTITLE DOES NOT APPLY TO SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION AND may not be construed to prohibit OR LIMIT the provision of

school construction funding outside a priority funding area.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to 30 31 the fiscal 2013 public school construction capital improvement program.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
