Office of Cemetery Oversight - Sunset Extension and Program Evaluation

FOR the purpose of continuing the Office of Cemetery Oversight in accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (Sunset Law) by extending to a certain date the termination provisions relating to statutory and regulatory authority of the Office; exempting private family cemeteries that do not conduct public sales from certain permitting and registration, perpetual care, and preneed contract requirements of the Maryland Cemetery Act; altering the membership of the Advisory Council on Cemetery Operations; increasing the number of times the Advisory Council is required to convene each year; requiring the Director of the Office of Cemetery Oversight to include certain information regarding the number of registrants and permit holders in a certain annual report; requiring the Director to provide a copy of certain annual reports to each member of the Advisory Council; requiring the Director, at certain times, to deliver to each member of the Advisory Council certain paperwork; requiring the Advisory Council to respond to issues raised in certain annual reports and develop a plan to study ongoing issues; authorizing a certain registration to be transferred under certain circumstances; requiring a certain annual report to include certain information on the number of inquiries received by the Office; requiring an applicant for a permit to submit certain documentation to the Director; requiring a certain disclosure to be made in a certain manner; requiring the Office to provide a report on the implementation of certain recommendations to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; requiring the Advisory Council to develop a plan for consumer outreach, study recordkeeping practices for cemeteries in a certain


