¹⁵ SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (1) Afghanistan or contiguous air space, as defined in federal 2 regulations, on or after October 24, 2001, and before a terminal date to be prescribed 3 by the United States Secretary of Defense; or
