- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Education and the State 4 Superintendent of Schools to assist each county board of education to establish $\mathbf{5}$ certain goals and objectives that conform with certain objectives for subject 6 areas that include science and social studies; requiring each public school to 7 survey current student achievement in science and social studies; requiring the 8 State Board and the State Superintendent to design and implement certain 9 assessment programs in certain subjects and requiring the social studies 10 assessment program to provide certain information; requiring certain grade band assessments and end-of-course assessments to be established. 11 12implemented, and administered annually at certain levels by a certain school year; requiring county boards of education to include certain information in the 1314boards' comprehensive master plans and updates to the plans; and generally 15relating to an education accountability program for certain core content areas.

public school shall implement a program of education accountability for the operation
and management of the public schools.

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The education accountability program shall include the following:

19 [(5)] (6) Evaluation programs shall be developed at the same time to 20 determine if the goals and objectives are being met; and

21 [(6)] (7) A reevaluation of programs, goals, and objectives shall be 22 undertaken regularly.

23 (c) National standardized testing may not be the only measure for 24 evaluating educational accountability.

(d) The Department shall assist each county board to establish an education
 accountability program by providing:

(1) Guidelines for development and implementation of the program bythe county boards; and

(e) The State Superintendent shall send the Governor and, subject to §
 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly a report each January
 that includes:

1 (1) Documentation of the progress of the Department, the county 2 boards, and each public school in this State towards their respective goals and 3 objectives; and

4 (2) Recommendations for legislation that the State Board and the 5 State Superintendent consider necessary to improve the quality of education in this 6 State.

7 (f) On the recommendation of the State Superintendent, the State Board 8 shall include in its annual budget request the funds it considers necessary to carry out 9 the provisions of this section.
