Higher Education - Volunteer Firefighters <u>The Charles W. Riley Fire and</u> <u>Emergency Medical Services</u> Scholarship

4 FOR the purpose of repealing a certain fire and emergency medical services tuition $\mathbf{5}$ <u>reimbursement program and establishing the Volunteer Firefighters <u>Charles W.</u></u> 6 Riley Fire and Emergency Medical Services Scholarship: establishing certain 7 eligibility requirements for a scholarship; authorizing the use of a scholarship 8 for certain educational expenses; prohibiting authorizing the annual amount of 9 a scholarship from exceeding awarded to be up to a certain percentage of the equivalent tuition and certain fees of a certain institution of higher education; 10 requiring a scholarship recipient to maintain a certain grade point average; 11
