1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Cecil County – Alcoholic Beverages – Class 6 Pub–Brewery Licenses**

3 FOR the purpose of adding Cecil County to the list of jurisdictions in which the holder
4 of a Class 6 pub–brewery license may sell malt beverages for off–premises
5 consumption in sealed refillable containers under certain circumstances; and
6 generally relating to Class 6 pub–brewery licenses in Cecil County.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
8 Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages

11 (2011 Replacement Volume)

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages**

15 2–207.

16 (g) (1) This subsection applies only in the following jurisdictions:

17 (i) City of Annapolis;

18 (ii) Anne Arundel County;

11 (2) The holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license may sell malt
12 beverages for off-premises consumption in sealed refillable containers.

13 (3) The containers may be returned and at the time of refill shall be
14 sealed by the pub-brewery licensee.

15 (4) A holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license may not sell malt
16 beverages to any retail alcoholic beverages licensee in this State for the purpose of a
17 subsequent sale or distribution of that malt beverage under the retail license.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
19 July 1, 2012.
