CHAPTER

AN ACT concerning 1

$\mathbf{2}$ Health Occupations - Public Disclosure of Professional Credentials and 3 **Reports on Advertising Regulations and Policies**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain advertisements for health care services to identify and fully spell out the license or certification of certain health care $\mathbf{5}$ 6 practitioners; prohibiting a certain advertisement from being misleading; 7 specifying what constitutes a misleading advertisement under this Act; requiring certain health care practitioners to disclose the practitioner's 8 9 licensure or certification by wearing a certain identification tag: providing for 10 the application of a certain provision of this Act; providing that health care 11 practitioners that fail to comply with certain provisions of this Act are subject to certain disciplinary actions: authorizing the appropriate regulatory board to 12 investigate an alleged violation of certain provisions of this Act; requiring 13certain regulatory boards to adopt certain regulations; prohibiting a physician 14 15 from making certain representations to the public under certain circumstances; altering the authority of a physician to advertise; defining certain terms; 16 requiring certain health occupation boards to submit certain information 17related to advertising by health care practitioners to certain committees of the 18 19General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to the 20public disclosure of professional credentials by health care practitioners.
