4	(1) constructing or maintaining a public work; or					
5	(2) buying or manufacturing machinery or equipment that:					
6	(i) is composed of at least 10,000 pounds of steel products; and					
7	(ii) is to be installed at a public work site.					
8	(b) This section does not apply if the head of a public body determines that:					
9 10	(1) the price of American steel products <b>OR AMERICAN MANUFACTURED GOODS</b> is not reasonable, as provided in § 17–304 of this subtitle;
