Vehicle Laws – Speed Monitoring Systems – Enforcement

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain persons to sign a statement that alleges, based 4 on inspection of recorded images from a speed monitoring system, that a motor $\mathbf{5}$ vehicle was being operated in violation of highway speed laws; authorizing 6 certain persons to swear to and affirm for evidentiary purposes, based on 7 inspection of recorded images from a speed monitoring system, that a motor vehicle was being operated in violation of highway speed laws; prohibiting 8 9 certain persons from receiving any salary or payments for services from a certain contractor; and generally relating to the enforcement of highway speed 10 11 laws using speed monitoring systems.
