## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Provisional Driver’s Licenses – Driver Education**  
3 **Requirements**

4 FOR the purpose of reducing the period of time that certain individuals at least a  
5 certain age who hold a learner’s instructional permit are required to wait before  
6 taking certain examinations for a provisional driver’s license; establishing that  
7 certain driving practice requirements and a requirement to complete a certain  
8 driver skills log book before taking certain examinations for a provisional  
9 driver’s license do not apply to an individual at least a certain age; and  
10 generally relating to driver education requirements for obtaining a provisional  
11 driver’s license.

12 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
13 Article – Transportation  
14 Section 16–105(d) and 16–111(b)  
15 Annotated Code of Maryland  
16 (2009 Replacement Volume and 2011 Supplement)

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Transportation**

20 16–105.

21 (d) (1) This subsection applies to an individual who:

22 (i) Seeks to obtain an original driver’s license under this  
23 subtitle; and

1 (ii) Does not qualify for a learner's instructional permit under  
2 subsection (e) of this section.

3 (2) An individual **UNDER THE AGE OF 25 YEARS** who holds a  
4 learner's instructional permit may not take a driver skills examination or driver road  
5 examination for a provisional license:

6 (i) Sooner than 9 months following the later of:

7 1. The date that the individual first obtains the learner's  
8 instructional permit; or

9 2. The date the individual was convicted of, or granted  
10 probation before judgment under § 6-220 of the Criminal Procedure Article for, a  
11 moving violation;

12 (ii) Until after successful completion of:

13 1. The driver education program approved under  
14 Subtitle 5 of this title, consisting of at least 30 hours of classroom instruction and at  
15 least 6 hours of highway driving instruction; and

16 2. At least 60 hours, 10 hours of which must occur  
17 during the period beginning 30 minutes before sunset and ending 30 minutes after  
18 sunrise, of behind-the-wheel driving practice supervised by an individual who:

19 A. Holds a valid driver's license;

20 B. Is at least 21 years old; and

21 C. Has been licensed to drive for at least 3 years; and

22 (iii) Unless the individual submits, in accordance with the  
23 Administration's regulations, a completed skills log book signed by:

24 1. Each supervising driver who certifies that the  
25 individual has satisfactorily demonstrated a required skill and has completed the  
26 driving practice requirements of item (ii)2 of this paragraph; and

27 2. If a signature of a parent, guardian, or other person is  
28 required under § 16-107 of this subtitle, the parent, guardian, or other person who  
29 signs the individual's application under that section.

30 (3) **AN INDIVIDUAL AT LEAST 25 YEARS OLD WHO HOLDS A**  
31 **LEARNER'S INSTRUCTIONAL PERMIT AND HAS NOT BEEN CONVICTED OF, OR**  
32 **GRANTED PROBATION BEFORE JUDGMENT FOR, A MOVING VIOLATION MAY NOT**

1 TAKE A DRIVER SKILLS EXAMINATION OR DRIVER ROAD EXAMINATION FOR A  
2 PROVISIONAL LICENSE:

3 (I) SOONER THAN 45 DAYS FOLLOWING THE DATE THAT  
4 THE INDIVIDUAL FIRST OBTAINS THE LEARNER'S INSTRUCTIONAL PERMIT; AND

5 (II) UNTIL AFTER SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF A  
6 STANDARD DRIVER EDUCATION PROGRAM APPROVED UNDER SUBTITLE 5 OF  
7 THIS TITLE, CONSISTING OF AT LEAST 30 HOURS OF CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION  
8 AND AT LEAST 6 HOURS OF HIGHWAY DRIVING INSTRUCTION.

9 (4) AN INDIVIDUAL AT LEAST 25 YEARS OLD WHO HOLDS A  
10 LEARNER'S INSTRUCTIONAL PERMIT AND HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF, OR  
11 GRANTED PROBATION BEFORE JUDGMENT FOR, AT LEAST ONE MOVING  
12 VIOLATION MAY NOT TAKE A DRIVER SKILLS EXAMINATION OR DRIVER ROAD  
13 EXAMINATION FOR A PROVISIONAL LICENSE:

14 (I) SOONER THAN 9 MONTHS FOLLOWING THE MOST  
15 RECENT DATE THE INDIVIDUAL WAS CONVICTED OF, OR GRANTED PROBATION  
16 BEFORE JUDGMENT FOR, A MOVING VIOLATION; AND

17 (II) UNTIL AFTER SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF A  
18 STANDARD DRIVER EDUCATION PROGRAM APPROVED UNDER SUBTITLE 5 OF  
19 THIS TITLE, CONSISTING OF AT LEAST 30 HOURS OF CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION  
20 AND AT LEAST 6 HOURS OF HIGHWAY DRIVING INSTRUCTION.

21 [(3)] (5) A learner's instructional permit issued to an individual  
22 described in paragraph (1) of this subsection expires 2 years after the date of issuance.

23 16-111.

24 (b) An applicant is entitled to receive a provisional license if the applicant:

25 (1) Meets the minimum age required under § 16-103(c)(2) of this  
26 subtitle;

27 (2) Satisfies the learner's instructional permit requirements under §  
28 16-105(d)(2), (3), OR (4) of this subtitle;

29 (3) Passes a driver skills or driver road examination administered  
30 under this subtitle;

31 (4) Surrenders any learner's instructional permit issued to the  
32 applicant; and

1                   (5)   Pays the fee established under this subtitle.

2                   SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
3   October 1, 2012.
