Vehicle Laws – Provisional Driver's Licenses – Driver Education Requirements

- 4 FOR the purpose of reducing the period of time that certain individuals at least a 5 certain age who hold a learner's instructional permit are required to wait before 6 taking certain examinations for a provisional driver's license; establishing that 7 certain driving practice requirements and a requirement to complete a certain driver skills log book before taking certain examinations for a provisional 8 9 driver's license do not apply to an individual at least a certain age; and generally relating to driver education requirements for obtaining a provisional 10 11 driver's license.
