AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1, 2013, the Department of General Services, in consultation with the Governor's Office of 14 Minority Affairs and the Maryland Department of Transportation, shall study the 15 Small Business Reserve Program to evaluate the Program's structure, composition, and 16 17 requirements for participation and its impact and shall report to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government 18 19 Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article. 20 on the implementation of this Act and the effect of this Act on small business 21participation in the Small Business Reserve Program recommendations concerning the 22 changes enacted by this Act to the requirements for participation in the Program, 23 including the Program's financial and employment guidelines, and additional legislation to implement any recommended changes. 24
  - SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of September 30, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
