AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1, 2013, the Department of General Services shall report to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, on the implementation of this Act and the effect of this Act on small business participation in the Small Business Reserve Program.
- SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of September 30, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
