Garrett County - Alcoholic Beverages - Special Class C Beer, Wine and Liquor License

FOR the purpose of authorizing in Garrett County the holder of a special Class C beer,
wine and liquor license to purchase beer and light wine from a wholesale dealer;
and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Garrett County.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages

16 (d) (1) (i) A special Class C beer, wine and liquor license entitles the 17 holder to exercise any of the privileges conferred by this class of license for the use of 18 any person holding a bona fide entertainment conducted by a club, society, or 19 association at the place described for a period not exceeding seven consecutive days, 20 upon the payment of a fee of \$15 per day.
