1 AN ACT concerning

2 Public Schools – Epinephrine Availability and Use – Policy Requirements

3 FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education to establish a policy to 4 authorize certain school personnel to administer auto-injectable epinephrine to $\mathbf{5}$ certain students under certain circumstances; requiring a certain policy to 6 include certain information; providing that a certain policy may authorize a 7 school nurse to obtain and store at a public school auto-injectable epinephrine 8 for certain purposes: requiring certain public schools to submit a certain report 9 to the State Department of Education; requiring the Department to develop and 10 disseminate a certain standard form; defining certain terms; and generally 11 relating to an epinephrine availability and use policy in public schools.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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1 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 2 MEANINGS INDICATED.

3 (2) "ANAPHYLAXIS" MEANS A SUDDEN, SEVERE, AND
4 POTENTIALLY LIFE-THREATENING ALLERGIC REACTION THAT OCCURS WHEN
5 AN INDIVIDUAL IS EXPOSED TO AN ALLERGEN.

6 (3) "AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE" MEANS A PORTABLE, 7 DISPOSABLE DRUG DELIVERY DEVICE THAT CONTAINS A PREMEASURED SINGLE 8 DOSE OF EPINEPHRINE THAT IS USED TO TREAT ANAPHYLAXIS IN AN 9 EMERGENCY SITUATION.

10 (B) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH A POLICY FOR PUBLIC 11 SCHOOLS WITHIN ITS JURISDICTION TO AUTHORIZE THE SCHOOL NURSE AND 12 OTHER SCHOOL PERSONNEL TO ADMINISTER AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE, 13 IF AVAILABLE, TO A STUDENT WHO IS DETERMINED TO BE OR PERCEIVED TO BE 14 IN ANAPHYLAXIS, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE STUDENT:

15 (1) HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AS HAVING AN ANAPHYLACTIC 16 ALLERGY, AS DEFINED IN § 7–426.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE; OR

17 (2) HAS A PRESCRIPTION FOR EPINEPHRINE AS PRESCRIBED BY
 18 AN AUTHORIZED LICENSED HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER UNDER THE HEALTH
 19 OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE.

20 (C) (1) The policy established under subsection (B) of this 21 Section shall include:

22(1)TRAINING FOR SCHOOL PERSONNEL ON HOW TO23RECOGNIZE THE SYMPTOMS OF ANAPHYLAXIS;

24(H) (2)PROCEDURESFORTHEEMERGENCY25ADMINISTRATION OF AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE;AND

26 (III) (3) THE PROPER FOLLOW-UP EMERGENCY 27 PROCEDURES,; AND

28(2) (4)THE POLICY MAY INCLUDE AAPROVISION29AUTHORIZING A SCHOOL NURSE TO OBTAIN AND STORE AT A PUBLIC SCHOOL30AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE TO BE USED IN AN EMERGENCY SITUATION.

31 (D) (1) EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL SHALL SUBMIT, ON THE FORM THAT 32 THE DEPARTMENT REQUIRES, A REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT ON EACH

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INCIDENT AT THE SCHOOL OR AT A RELATED SCHOOL EVENT THAT REQUIRED
 THE USE OF AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE.

3 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP AND DISSEMINATE A 4 STANDARD FORM TO REPORT EACH INCIDENT REQUIRING THE USE OF 5 AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE AT A PUBLIC SCHOOL.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 July 1, 2012.
