A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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County Personnel – Employee Grievances and Complaints

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain counties with a certain minimum number of 4 employees to keep certain records relating to employee grievances or complaints $\mathbf{5}$ for a certain fiscal year; requiring certain counties to submit a certain report to 6 the Employee Relations Division of the Department of Budget and Management 7 on or before a certain date; requiring the Employee Relations Division of the 8 Department of Budget and Management to compile the reports from the 9 counties and submit a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; 10 and generally relating to employee grievances or complaints procedures in 11 12certain counties.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That:

15 (a) For fiscal year 2013, each county that has at least 6,500 full-time 16 employees shall keep a record of:

17 (1) the number of employee grievances or complaints that are filed 18 with the unit of county government that administers personnel issues; and

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(2) the time that it takes to resolve each grievance or complaint.

(b) On or before August 1, 2013, each county required to keep records under
subsection (a) of this section shall send a report to the Employee Relations Division of
the Department of Budget and Management on the following information for fiscal
year 2013:

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(1) the number of employee grievances or complaints that were filed;



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$\frac{1}{2}$	(2) the average length of time for a grievance or complaint to be resolved;
$\frac{3}{4}$	(3) the length of time required for a grievance or complaint to be resolved under county or State law;
$5\\6$	(4) the number of times that the time for resolution required by law was exceeded; and
7 8	(5) an explanation for delays in resolving grievances and complaints within the time required by law.
9 10 11 12 13	(c) On or before November 1, 2013, the Employee Relations Division of the Department of Budget and Management shall compile the reports received under subsection (b) of this section, and submit the compilation to the Senate Finance Committee and the House Appropriations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article.
14 15 16 17	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2012. It shall remain effective for a period 2 years and, at the end of May 31, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
