# A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

# Maryland Constitution – Congressional Districts – Requirements as to Territory, Form, and Boundaries

# FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution to specify that the districts for the election of members of the Congress of the United States shall conform to certain requirements as to territory, form, natural boundaries, and political subdivision boundaries; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses 15 concurring), That it be proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

# Article XV – Miscellaneous

17 **12.** 

18 WITH DUE REGARD TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CONSTITUTION OF 19 THE UNITED STATES AND FEDERAL LAW, EACH DISTRICT FOR THE ELECTION OF 20 A MEMBER OF THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES SHALL CONSIST OF 21 ADJOINING TERRITORY, BE COMPACT IN FORM, AND ENSURE THAT DUE REGARD 22 IS GIVEN TO NATURAL BOUNDARIES AND THE BOUNDARIES OF POLITICAL 23 SUBDIVISIONS.



### **SENATE BILL 805**

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly 2 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act 3 affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the 4 Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not 5 apply.

6 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section 7proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the 8 qualified voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November, 2012 9 for their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. At that general election, the vote on this proposed amendment to the Constitution 10 11 shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now 12provided by law. Immediately after the election, all returns shall be made to the 13Governor of the vote for and against the proposed amendment, as directed by Article 14XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further proceedings had in accordance with 1516Article XIV.
