A BILL ENTITLED

Environment – Sewage Disposal Systems

1 AN ACT concerning

FOR the purpose of establishing that the State may not prohibit the installation of any on-site sewage disposal system until a certain amount of time after certain overflows at sewage pumping stations are fully mitigated and certain capital improvements are made to the sewage pumping stations responsible for the overflows; and generally relating to sewage disposal systems.
BY adding to Article – Environment Section 9–1110 Annotated Code of Maryland (2007 Replacement Volume and 2011 Supplement)
Preamble
WHEREAS, The State of Maryland contributes only 20% of the total nitrogen load of the Chesapeake Bay; and
WHEREAS, Septic systems contribute only 4% to 8% of Maryland's nitrogen load; and
WHEREAS, As a result, Maryland's septic systems contribute no more than 0.8% to 1.6% of the total nitrogen load of the Chesapeake Bay; and
WHEREAS, Over 100 million gallons of raw sewage overflowed from the Patapsco Sewage Pumping Station in Baltimore County into tributaries of the Chesapeake Bay in August and September of 2011; and

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1 WHEREAS, Over 20 million gallons of raw sewage overflowed from sewage 2 pumping stations in Prince George's County into tributaries of the Chesapeake Bay in 3 August and September of 2011; now, therefore,

- 4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
 - Article Environment
- 7 **9–1110.**

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8 THE STATE MAY NOT PROHIBIT THE INSTALLATION OF ANY ON-SITE 9 SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM UNTIL AT LEAST **3** YEARS AFTER:

10 (1) ANY OVERFLOW OF 100,000 GALLONS OR MORE OF SEWAGE 11 FROM A SEWAGE PUMPING STATION THAT OCCURS ON OR AFTER AUGUST 1, 12 2011, IS MITIGATED; AND

13(2) THE SEWAGE PUMPING STATION RESPONSIBLE FOR THE14OVERFLOW IS SUFFICIENTLY UPGRADED WITH CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TO15PREVENT FUTURE OVERFLOWS.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectJune 1, 2012.

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
