SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 2 (a) This section applies only in Prince George's County.
 - (e) (1) A license may not be granted to sell alcoholic beverages in any building located within 1,000 feet of a school building, or within 500 feet of a church. The 1,000 feet, or the 500 feet, as the case may be, is to be measured from the front door or main entrance, whichever is nearest the street abutting the premises, of the proposed licensed establishment along the nearest usual pedestrian route to the door closest to the licensed premises which is used as an entrance or exit to any school, or to the main entrance of the church building.
 - (2) [This] EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (7) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THIS restriction does not apply in the case of a church if the governing body of the church concerned consents in writing to the granting of the license. The consent shall be filed with the application. The license of any person or persons or for the use of a corporation or unincorporated association issued for any building located within the requisite distance from a church or school building may be renewed or extended for the same building.
 - (3) This restriction does not apply to any transfer or assignment of a license located within the distance of 1,000 feet to another place of business within the specified distance and/or to an assignee of the license within the distance of the same church or school building.
- 21 (4) This does not apply to the issuance of a license for a place of 22 business, not having an alcoholic beverage license, to which an alcoholic beverage 23 license had been issued and was in force and effect on June 1, 1965, as to a license of 24 the same class which was in force and effect as of that date, applied for in the place of 25 business nor to a renewal of a license of any establishment where, subsequent to the 26 original granting of the license a school or church building was erected within 1,000 feet.
- 28 (5) This subsection does not apply to any license issued under \S 29 6–201(r)(2), (4), (5), (15), (16), or (18) or \S 7–101 of this article.
- 30 (6) This restriction does not apply in the case of a private kindergarten 31 or nursery school.
