#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Health Occupations – Qualifications for Licensure – Mortuary Science, Funeral Direction, and Apprenticeship

FOR the purpose of altering the circumstances under which the State Board of
Morticians and Funeral Directors is required to issue a mortician or funeral
director license to certain individuals; requiring an individual who is seeking
approval of an apprentice license to complete certain credits at a certain school
or in a certain course that has both a certain accreditation and is approved by
the Board; and generally relating to the requirements for licensure in mortuary
science and funeral direction and for approval of an apprentice license.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(b) The Board shall examine all applications for licensure for the practice of
 mortuary science or funeral direction and shall issue the mortician or funeral director
 license to an individual who:

6 (d) (1) Prior to an individual appearing before the Board for approval of 7 an apprentice license, the individual must complete two-thirds of the academic credits 8 for a mortuary science program at a school **OR IN A COURSE** accredited by the 9 American Board of Funeral Service [or] **AND** approved by the Board, with a 2.0 grade 10 point average or higher that is verified with a certified copy of the college transcript.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2012.
