1 AN ACT concerning

Health Occupations – Qualifications for Licensure – Mortuary Science, Funeral Direction, and Apprenticeship

4 FOR the purpose of altering the circumstances under which the State Board of $\mathbf{5}$ Morticians and Funeral Directors is required to issue a mortician or funeral 6 director license to certain individuals; requiring an individual who is seeking 7 approval of an apprentice license to complete certain credits at a certain school 8 or in a certain course that has both a certain accreditation and is approved by 9 the Board; providing that certain provisions of this Act do not apply to certain individuals; requiring the Board to adopt certain regulations on or before a 10 11 certain date; and generally relating to the requirements for licensure in 12 mortuary science and funeral direction and for approval of an apprentice 13license.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 (b) The Board shall examine all applications for licensure for the practice of 3 mortuary science or funeral direction and shall issue the mortician or funeral director 4 license to an individual who:

5 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, has graduated with 6 an associate of arts degree in mortuary science or its equivalent from a school 7 accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service Education [or] AND approved by 8 the Board, or has acquired at least an associate of arts degree and completed a course 9 in mortuary science that is accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service 10 Education [or] AND approved by the Board;

12 (d) (1) Prior to an individual appearing before the Board for approval of 13 an apprentice license, the individual must complete two-thirds of the academic credits 14 for a mortuary science program at a school **OR IN A COURSE** accredited by the 15 American Board of Funeral Service [or] **AND** approved by the Board, with a 2.0 grade 16 point average or higher that is verified with a certified copy of the college transcript.

17SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That §§ 7–303 and 7–306 of the Health Occupations Article as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, regardless of 18 whether the individual performed clinical embalming in a laboratory or a funeral 19 20home setting, do not apply to an individual who: 21(1)applied for an apprentice license on or before October 1, 2011; and 22had completed two-thirds of the academic credits at an approved (2)mortuary science program at the time of application. 2324SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That on or before December 1. 2012, the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors shall adopt regulations to 2526implement §§ 7–303 and 7–306 of the Health Occupations Article as enacted by 27Section 1 of this Act. 28SECTION 2. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
