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## State Department of Education – Oral Health Education <del>- Certification and Monitoring</del>

- FOR the purpose of requiring certain county superintendents to make certain 4 certifications regarding oral health education on or before a certain date each 5 6 <del>year;</del> requiring the State Department of Education to support and facilitate 7 certain oral health education and, develop a process to monitor certain 8 implementation of certain education, and submit a certain summary to the 9 Governor and General Assembly on or before a certain date; requiring the State 10 Board of Education to encourage certain county boards of education to incorporate certain lessons into certain curriculum; requiring the Department to 11 report certain information to the Governor and General Assembly on or before a 12 certain date each year; and generally relating to oral health education in the 13 14 State.

15	The State Board shall encourage the county boards to incorporate
16	age-appropriate lessons on dating violence, ORAL DISEASE PREVENTION, AND
17	DENTAL HEALTH PROMOTION into the county boards' health education curriculum.
